## BODY PARAGRAPH PLANNING (This is preparation for writing an essay.)

- Use the handout from class (or find a copy on the website) about planning the body paragraphs for an essay. Remember to answer the question in the prompt during your planning: Describe a machine you can't live without. Why would your life be difficult without this machine?
- Write your machine in the blank. You are only planning. You are not actually writing the paragraphs.
- Make sure that you are **not** writing complete sentences, especially on the details. Use words or phrases to organize your ideas. Look back at the P.E. example for guidance.
- Make sure your 3 topic sentences are broad enough that you can include 3 details for each one.

Don't panic if you can't think of something. You will get the chance to discuss your findings with others who are focusing on the same topic in class next week.
