Jobs of the Literature Circle

Discussion Director: Your job is to develop a list of questions that your group might want to discuss about a part of the book. Usually best discussion questions come from your own reactions and concerns as you read. You make this list before, during, and after reading. Use the Types of Questions sentence starters to help you develop a variety of questions.

Creative Connector: Your job is to help everyone make connections to other ideas: what we've learned in class, stories we've read, movies you've watched OR let them connect to their prior knowledge. You should prepare questions to ask the group which might help them connect. You may also share your connections.

Literary Luminary: You pick a few passages from the assigned reading that you find especially interesting or meaningful. You are to share them with the group, so you may need to practice reading them aloud.

<u>Word Wizard:</u> You are ready to bring out the magic in the author's words. You'll be searching for new, interesting, strange, puzzling, or unfamiliar words. You should jot down such words while reading; then look them up in the dictionary. In the group, you'll help the members find and discuss these words. You might even ask them what they think the meaning is!

Stupendous Summarizer: Your job is to summarize what you have read by writing down the major events or points in the reading. You will also add any contributions that your group makes during discussions. You will identify elements that move the plot along, like characters, setting, major events, conflict, etc.

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
